GRADUATION INFORMATION

All graduates of Saint Francis will receive a College Preparatory Diploma. Transcripts will have notations for the type of program the student has completed.

A College Preparatory transcript must show 23 units as stated in the graduation requirements. A College Preparatory diploma with Distinction requires 24 units, including 7 units in Honors or AP Courses; 1 unit in an AP core course; 1 Math unit in Honors Pre-Calculus or higher; 3 units of Foreign Language; and an average of 87 or higher in each core subject area.

Honors Graduates are students who obtain a 90% or above in all core subject areas.

Each grade is typically composed of 70–80 students. In each of the classes, more than 98% of the students choose to attend a four-year institution immediately following graduation.

The Class of 1997 was the first graduating class from the high school.
